Course Objective:

This course is designed to introduce students to several advanced topics of financial accounting. It provides an understanding of the accounting methods for business combination resulting in merger, takeover, and acquisition, investments, and the consolidation of financial statements. In addition, the course offers an understanding of accounting for partnerships, and foreign currency transactions.

Course Content:

- 1. Business combinations
- 2. Stock investments-investor accounting and reporting
- 3. An introduction to consolidated financial statements
- 4. Consolidation techniques and procedures
- 5. Intercompany profit transactions (inventories, plant assets)
- 6. Derivatives and foreign currency: Concepts and common transactions
- 7. Accounting for derivatives and hedging activities
- 8. Foreign currency financial statements
- 9. Partnership (formation, operations and changes in ownership interests)
- 10. Partnership liquidation.

- 2. Discuss derivatives and foreign currency concepts and transactions.
- 3. Discuss the accounting issues related to partnerships formation, operations, changes in ownership interests, and liquidation.

- 5. Apply translation and remeasurement of foreign currency financial statements.
- 6. Apply techniques for derivatives and foreign currency transactions .

- 8. Analyze complex and unstructured mergers, acquisitions and investments situations using critical thinking and appropriate tools and techniques.
